Interment Guidelines

Ruapehu District Council would like to advise the purchasers of plots situated in the Taumarunui, Manunui, Ohakune and Raetihi Lawn (Berm) Cemeteries the following information applies to all interments.

Council's Obligations:

- Council will dig and reinstate the grave.
- Council will provide a concrete berm on which all plot memorials/headstones shall be constructed.
- Council will maintain the cemetery in a tidy state.

Purchasers Rights and Obligations:

- You are entitled to erect, and obliged thereafter to maintain, memorials/headstones upon the concrete berm provided by Council. Plinths (concrete base of memorials/headstones) are not to be any higher than 150mm, with clearances on all sides of 150mm. Plinths are to be no wider than 1.00 metre on a single plot (or 2 metres on a double plot). Memorial/headstone heights are not to exceed 0.840 metres above the berm and are to be constructed only in granite or similar material approved by Council.
- An application to Erect a Headstone must be completed prior to erection of any memorial.
- Ashes plots vary in width, and memorials/headstones can be erected within the available space, provided there are side clearances on all sides of 150 mm.
- Shrubs, trees, flower plants, cobblestones, and adornments, are not permitted to be planted upon any plots. This practice makes it difficult and expensive for Council to maintain the plots.
- Adornments of any type are not permitted upon any plots, with the exception of vase or plant containers housed in insets within the plinth.

Note:

Council **does not** provide beams, site matting, and lowering devices required for the interment. Those items may be obtained from local funeral directors if you require them.
