The Board received addresses as follows:

- Member Nottage advised that he had been to Waiouru and seen the new lights.
- Member Nottage discussed that the community of Waiouru would like to see more advertising, notifying when the Waimarino-Waiouru Community Board Meetings are held in Waiouru. Notice on Community Centre Notice Board and advising the Army was suggested. Council's Group Manager Community Services advised that this could be done.
- Member Nottage advised that he will be trialling the lights in the Jubilee Park area at Queen's Birthday Weekend. The power point is working by the Memorial gate.
- Mayor Cameron reported on the After 4 Business Meeting run by Koa Group from Ohakune, with Vision Manawatu giving a presentation, on the next stage for Tourism for business within the Region. The Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment is also involved in this for our region.
- Member Nottage advised he had been approached by some people in the community to see if it was possible to have a pedestrian crossing by the corner of Ayr and Goldfinch Street, Ohakune, where the existing courtesy crossing is by TCB Ski Shop. Council's Group Manager Community Services advised that they could liaise with Council's Land Transport and Economic Development Manager, to see if it is feasible and if so, the community would need to supply information to the Waimarino-Waiouru Community Board to seek approval. Deputy Chairperson Hotter advised that it was extremely hard to obtain pedestrian crossings and they had been unsuccessful in trying to gain one for the Primary School.
- Member Pehi suggested that there could be some community Notice Boards put up to put the Community Board's feedback on, allowing the Community to be able to be informed on items. Council's Group Manager Customer Services, advised that Council is in the process of getting the information after each meeting onto the Council Facebook page which should be up and running in the next two months. The Council Website is also in process of being updated to include more about what Council does, with and for the Communities.
- Mayor Cameron advised that the Army in Waiouru is in the process of making a Community Notice Board for information to be displayed, to help keep community members up to date with Community Board Workings.
