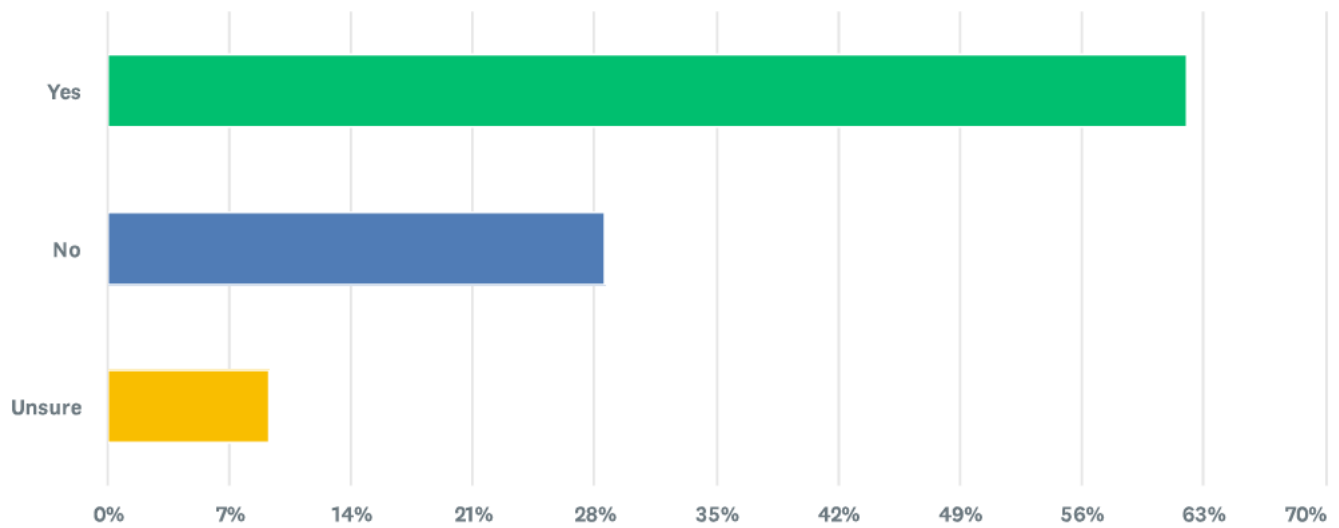

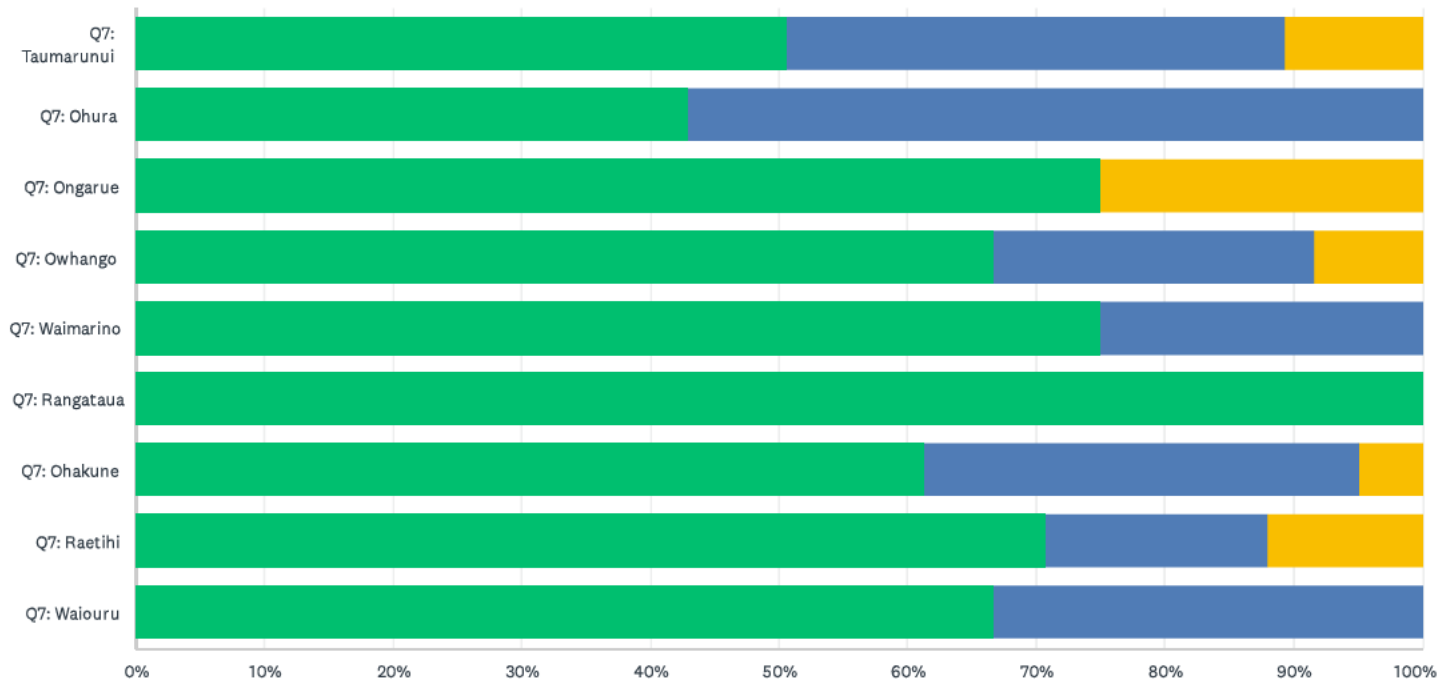
Should Council have a role in supporting youth development?

Q1 Should Council have a role in supporting youth development?

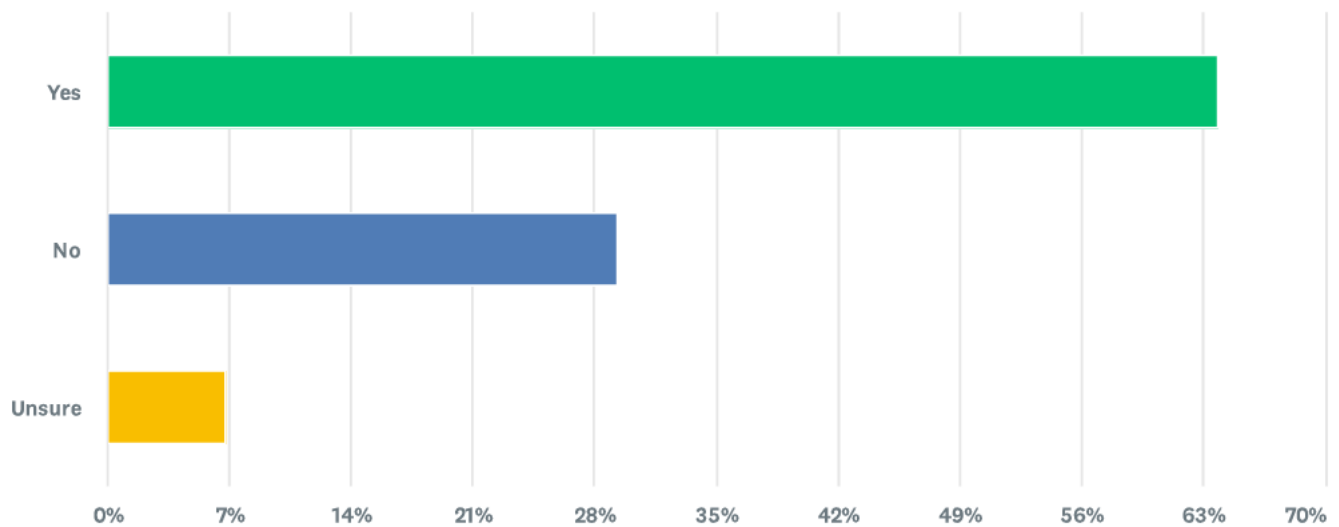

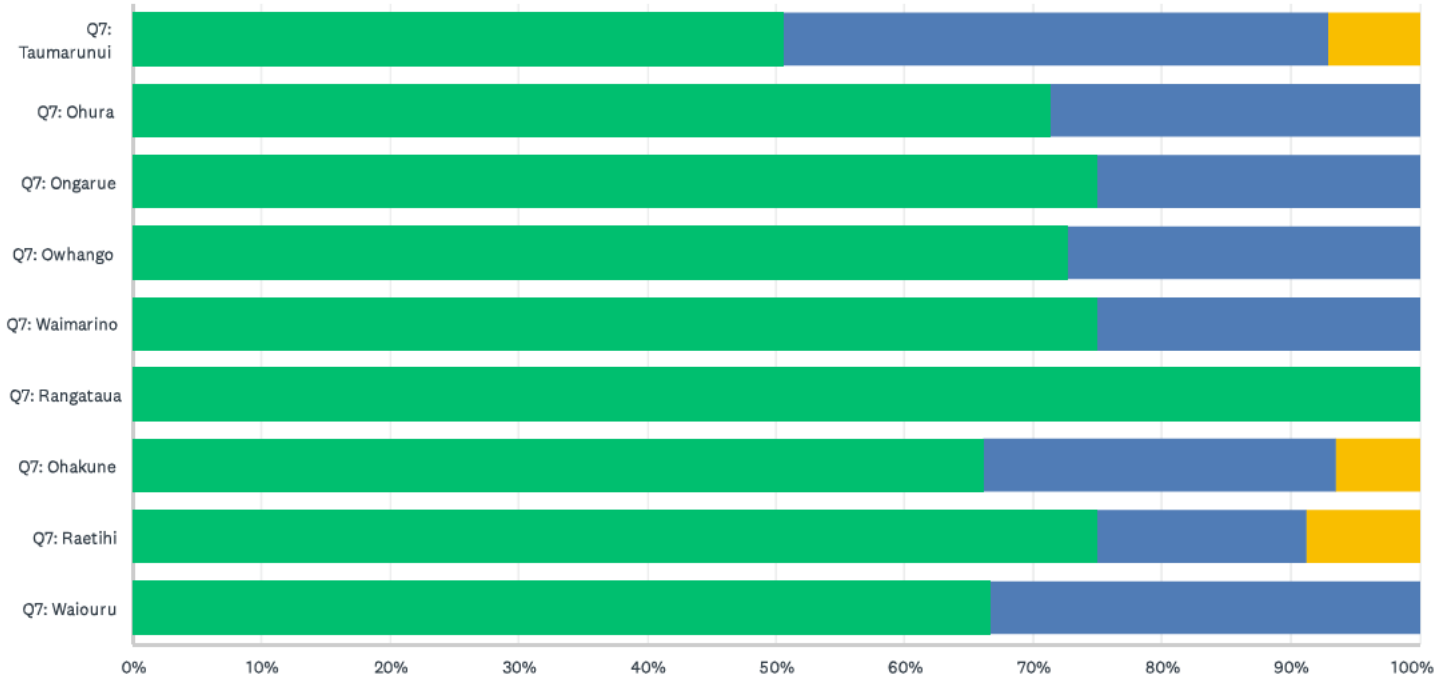

Q2 Should Council provide opportunities for young people to participate in Council decision-making?

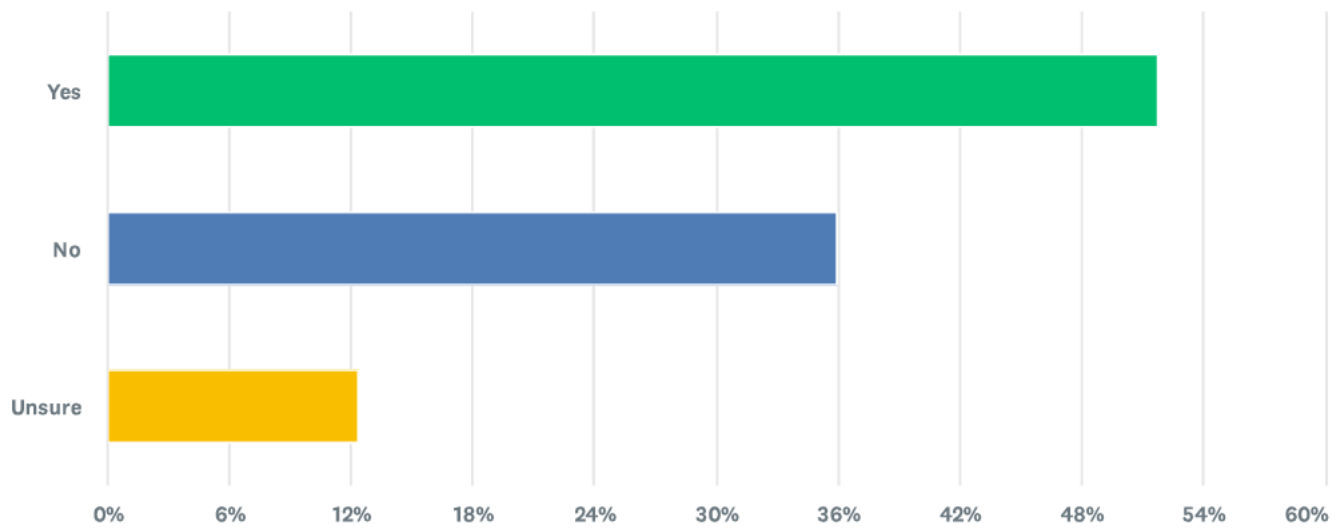

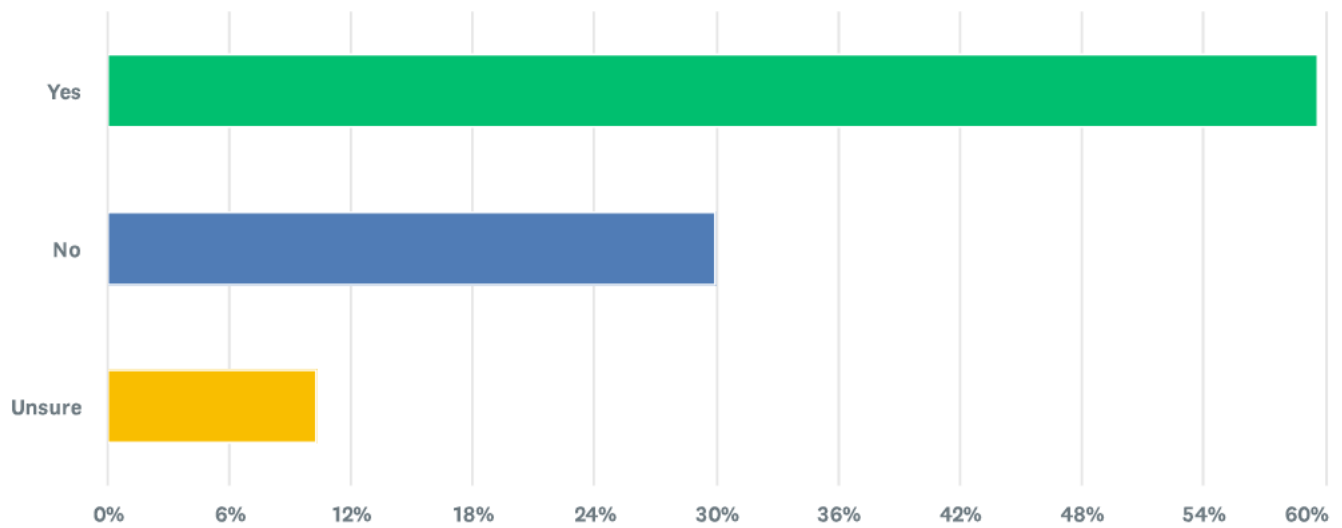

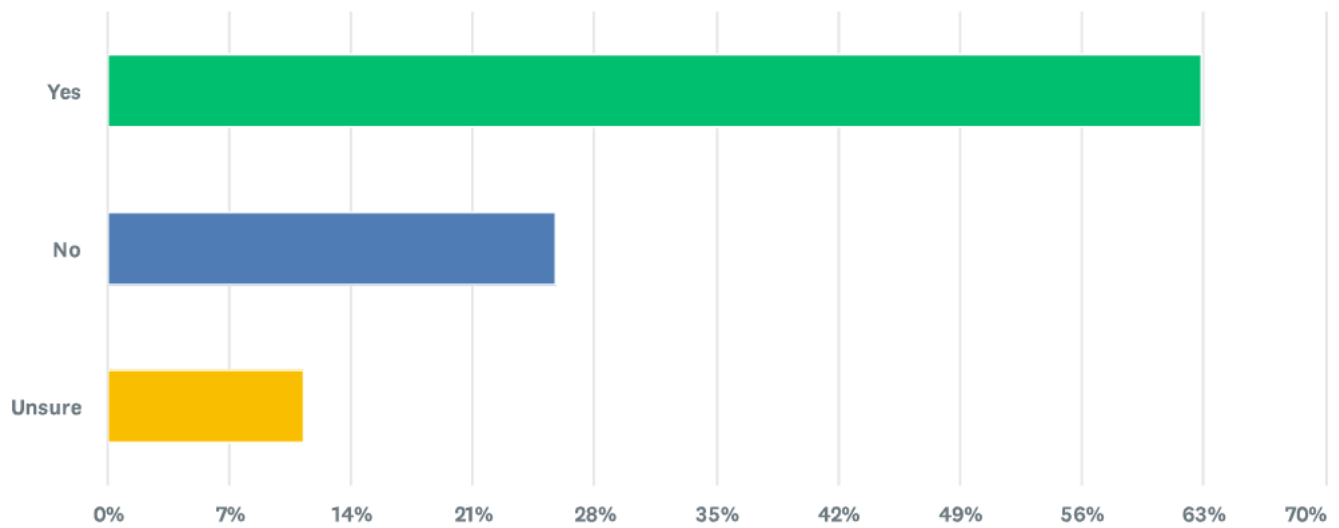

A Youth Council is worthwhile only if rangatahi have genuine access to information, decision-makers and Council processes—and can see how their advice has influenced actual decisions. Membership must represent the whole district, including Māori rangatahi, rural communities, smaller settlements, alternative education, young workers and those who are not already confident or high-achieving. Council must provide transport, mentoring, meeting support and appropriate recognition or payment so participation is not limited to young people whose families can afford it. I am also concerned by the wording in question 5 - "youth-led initiatives that align with Council's goals." Rangatahi should not receive support only when their ideas fit priorities already determined by adults. Youth development must give young people room to identify their own priorities, question Council and propose new directions. The Youth Council should have a clear mandate, an annual budget, speaking rights before relevant Council committees and a requirement for Council to formally respond to its recommendations. Outcomes should be reported publicly so the community can see what was proposed, funded and achieved. Young people are not merely "future leaders." 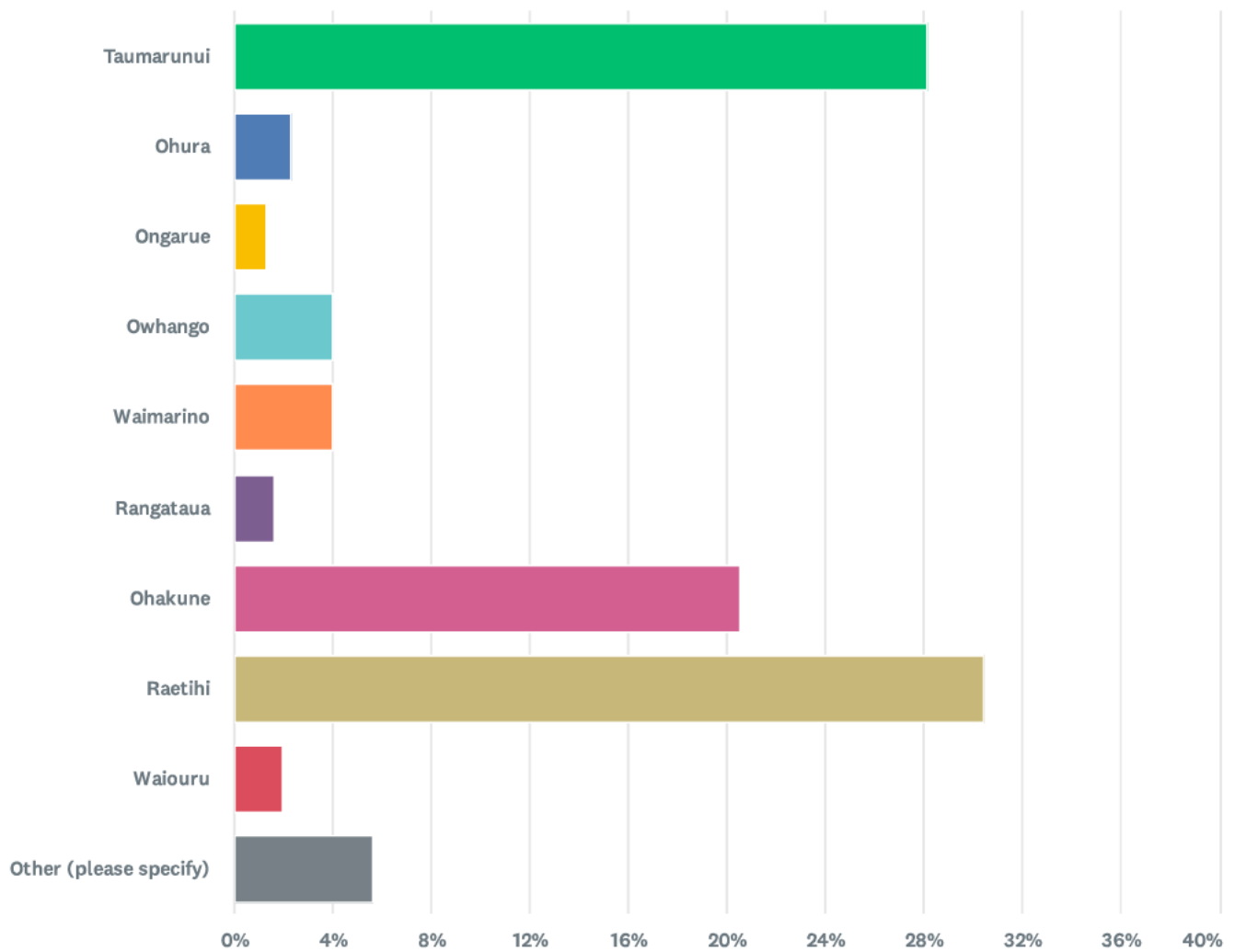

Where do you live?

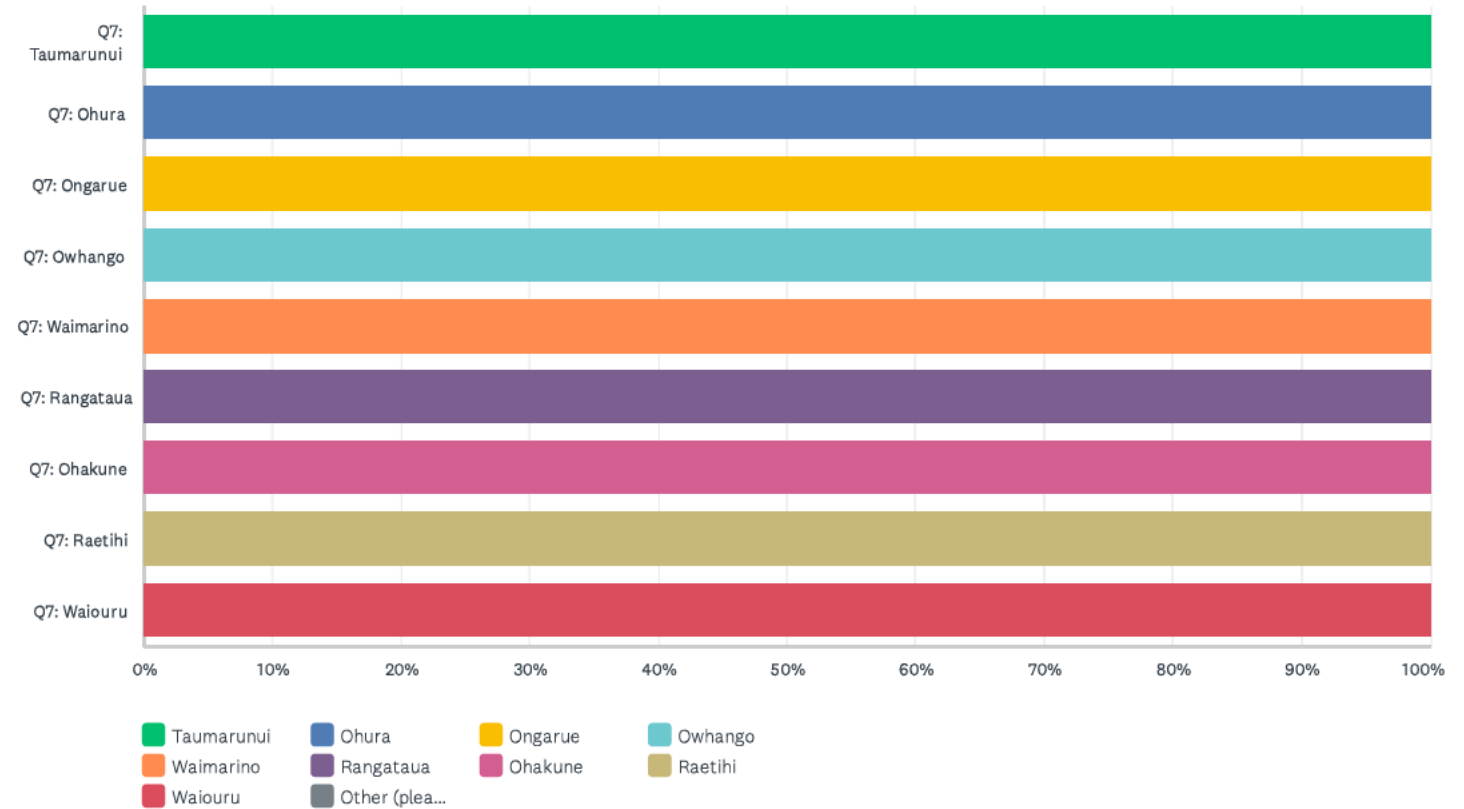
