Submission to Ruapehu District Council on their Representation Review 2022

#### **OUR SUBMISSION**

- 1. Federated Farmers welcomes the opportunity to submit to Ruapehu District Council on the 2021 representation review.
- We would like to be heard on our submission.
- Federated Farmers represents hundreds of members from the Ruapehu district who are currently going through the busiest part of their year. Our members struggle for time to submit individually which is why this Federated Farmers submission needs to be weighted appropriately.
- 4. Federated Farmers wishes to address the importance of the agricultural sector to Ruapehu. Rural Ruapehu are significant contributors to the economy employing overall more than any other industry in the district. It is even more critical to the success of the district since Covid restrictions have had a negative impact on the districts tourism industry and ski fields. Rural Ruapehu also pay considerably more in rates due to the countries land value-based rating system.
- 5. Our submission has been developed using feedback received from our members in the district and written by our policy advisors who have experience with representation on every district, region, and territorial council in New Zealand.
- 6. We do appreciate that council have made the decision to include Māori representation in their structure and Federated Farmers supports council's decision so long as rural representation is not impacted from the inclusion.
- 7. Council have initially proposed a Māori ward, general ward, and a mayor. The six general ward councillors are voted for at large with a mayor additionally included.

#### In short

- Federated Farmers does not support Councils "At Large" approach to representation.
- Have the general ward divided to four wards.
- Have three community boards representing the three towns in which most rural areas utilise for amenities
- Introduce one additional councillor to improve rural Ruapehu's representation shortage over Taumarunui.

#### **Our Proposal**

- 8. We wish to seek changes to the ward structure. Federated Farmers suggests the general ward be split into four wards with an overall 10 councillors excluding the mayor. The Māori ward will stay the same and have an additional Mayor taken at large.
  - Ohura-Ngapuke (one councillor)
  - National Park (two councillors)
  - Waimarino-Waiouru (two Councillors)

- Taumarunui (three councillors).
- Three community boards National Park, Waimarino-Waiouru and Taumarunui-Ohura-Ngapuke with a 50/50 split of urban and rural board members to ensure both voices of the communities are spoken for.
- 10. Our reasoning is explained in detail below.

#### Councillors

11. Under our proposal increasing the number of councillors by one would be done with the loss of one community board. This increase in councillors will mean that the average population per councillor decreases and the access each resident has to a local councillor increases. Councillors have more governing authority and voting rights than that of a community board and we wish to ensure that there is strong rural representation.

- 12. As outlined in councils' proposal the graph above shows similar sized councils. These councils are different from that of Ruapehu. Otorohanga, Greymouth and Gore are all large towns with a rural population accessing one central area. Ruapehu has several communities such as Ohakune, Waiouru and Taumarunui which mean more decisions are required to be made with towns infrastructure and community needs. For councillors to stay on top of these communities they need to be from the distinct communities of interest they represent. Community boards do manage some of these issues however, overall governance is at councillor not community board level.
- 13. Although the districts population is lower than that of larger district councils the same decision-making processes are required. Council needs to maintain enough councillors to make the best decisions for the district without over representing. Federated Farmers thinks this is 10 councillors with an additional mayor.
- 14. Federated Farmers wishes to retain wards to ensure that rural representation is maintained at the table. The introduction of the 'at large' system for the general ward risks overpopulating council with urban focused councillors who may not comprehend the diverse needs of the rural Ruapehu. This has been a common issue identified around New Zealand with a growing urban population. This issue is going to become more important as population trends in Ruapehu shows a decreasing population except for Taumarunui.
- 15. The district has so many small communities of interest that generally all come to one of the several main hubs in the district. Therefore, our choice of ward locations has considered the access to urban areas as community of interests that councillors can represent. For example,

rural residents from around Taumarunui use the town for shopping and schooling and generally will have similar community issues that a councillor needs to understand. The same can be said for the other wards.

16. To ensure that smaller communities of interest maintain representation, council is permitted to deviate from the +-10% rule scheduled under the Local Electoral Act. This is important to consider with such a vast range of communities living outside of Taumarunui and Ohakune which both hold a large proportion of the population.

#### 17. The +/- 10% Rule

The Local Electoral Act 2001 requires local authorities to provide for 'the 'fair representation of electors' by ensuring there's a reasonably equal ratio of people per councillor (the "+/- 10% rule"). Exceptions can be made where:

- non-compliance is required for effective representation of communities of interest within island communities or isolated communities.
- compliance would limit effective representation of communities of interest by dividing a community of interest.
- compliance would limit effective representation of communities of interest by uniting two or more communities of interest with few commonalities.

#### **Community Boards**

- 18. Changes to the current board structure proposed to ensure that the right communities are connected. One of the issues with community boards in a district such as Ruapehu is that there are several small communities of interest that would not be large enough to be under their own community board.
- 19. The three boards are chosen due to their ability to access council and similar amenities such as schooling, community halls and shopping. Both the urban residents and the rural communities accessing these towns deserve a say in how the towns are developed. Therefore, the Federation is proposing having half the board made up from the residential areas of Taumarunui, Ohakune and Waiouru and half from rural. These are the three main hubs in which the community turn to for their shopping and community related events.
- 20. When Council considers our submission, Federated Farmers would rather have a strong wards system over Community boards to ensure the rural people are represented. In the federations view removing community boards would be accepted if it was to make way for our proposed general wards.
- 21. As discussed in councils supporting documentation for representation there are other forms of representation that the community has taken up such as, Sport Whanganui, local clubs, and Ruapehu Federated Farmers. It is understood tourism operators such as the ski fields already have a strong relationship with council as well. Community boards will enable the towns to be designed and function effectively whilst allowing the district wide decisions to

be made by councillors with contributions from these other forms of representation such as Federated Farmers.







Representation Review - a lost opportunity The six yearly reviews of our representation give us an opportunity to look at what works and what doesn't in our governance, they also give us the opportunity for a root and branch restructure. This one has been exceptional, or has it? We've seen the long overdue establishment of Maori Wards, an expansion in the number of community boards and a reduction in the number of councillors. On the face of it a radical restructuring but in reality it is more like rearranging the furniture. Here are some figures: \$294,912; \$26,810; \$33,114; \$6,304; and \$0. \$294,912 is the amount of money set aside to pay councillors annually a sum fixed by the remuneration authority. \$26,810 is the basic amount councillors are each paid at the moment with eleven seats. \$33,114 is the amount councillors will receive annually if there is a reduction in the number of seats to 8 as recommended by council in the representation review. \$6,304 is the pay rise newly elected councillors will receive at the next election and \$0 is the amount community board members will receive for taking on the as yet unspecified work that a reduced council will devolve to them. So how did we arrive at a smaller council paying themselves more to do less work with an increase in responsibilities going to community boards? The short answer is Maori Wards. Because of the fixed amount councillors are paid through the remuneration pool, the addition of Maori Wards will reduce the amount paid to them. As a number of councillors are stepping down at the next election it occurred to members that a reduction in their number would solve the problem of their pay being reduced and so a leaner council with greater responsibilities for and increased number of boards was born and there is a lot to like. Taumarunui and Ohura will get the boards they have long asked for and there should be much greater accountability. But a lot depends on structure and the relationship between the boards and council which at the moment can best be described as semi detached. At the moment there is no direct link to council from the boards. The powers and responsibilities of our boards are far more limited than other rural councils. Our board members are not allowed to talk to Council CEO Clive Manley except through the board chair. Board members are not allowed council email addresses, business cards, or the level of IT support councillors receive. They receive no allowances for their phones or stationary. They are not expected to ask serious questions of council and when they do they are stonewalled, when they make the questions formal under LGOIMA they are asked to pay a fee to

dissuade them. More importantly in terms of the representation review, is the fact that the two boards were excluded from taking part in the review process at workshop level. The first the boards heard about their sudden inclusion in the governance process was when the proposals went out for consultation. At that point he Waimarino Waiouru Community Board put forward proposals to for an increase in powers and responsibilities in line with those recommended for boards by Local Government New Zealand. It took just five minutes for Council to dismiss the proposals at their August meeting. Council says it is for new Council to decide the roles and responsibilities of the boards and their relationship to the new Council as though it is for others to decide yet all those members not retiring are hoping to be reelected. If the relationship between Council and the community boards were a marriage it would be either in counselling or heading for divorce. Local government is about structure and how we frame our decision making. So far Council has given itself a pay rise and less work but it has kicked the can up the road on how we are to govern after the next election. Looking at how we can represent our communities more effectively in terms of our governing structure seems to have come a poor second. What responsibilities and powers will the new boards have? What will the new relationship with Council be like? Will Council incorporate the proposals from the Waimarino Waiouru Board or will it be business as usual with a little extra work for the boards taking up the slack from a reinvented streamlined and hopefully strategic Council. What of Maori representation? Council has settled on a maximum of just two Maori Wards, the Maori Council wanted parity with the general wards. Feedback from Maori community members I have spoken with want at least three seats. Many see the reduced number of Councillors as simply giving Councillors a pay increase and reducing Maori influence on Council. Certainly on the face of it that's how it looks. The arguments made by the Mayor and a number of other Councillors that there aren't sufficient number of Maori electors on the Maori Roll don't stack up when you take into account the districts Maori population which is nearly 50% of the districts total population. It would seem to be both disingenuous and opportunistic to claim their seat numbers must be restricted because of the low Maori Roll numbers, and in the next breath say but of course we'd welcome more members from Maori Wards in three years time if they build their roll numbers up. Why wait? The number of Maori should ethically dictate the number of seats not an artificially low roll that was based on the general election when Maori electors on the register hadn't taken into account the possibility of Maori Wards actually being successfully proposed. Whilst Maori Wards will give Mana Whenua a seat at the table they are still General Seats in that they are not there solely to represent Maori. Effective representation for Maori can only take place if there is a forum with direct links to Council for all of the districts iwi. Strengthening the Maori Council to have a

direct input into Council has long been an aspiration of Mana Whenua in the district. The Representation Review gives Council a unique opportunity to improve both its relationship with Mana Whenua and their representation. The opportunity should embraced not held at arms length. These are issues that need to be discussed now and put out to consultation alongside the number of members and boards, not deferred till after the next election. Unless we do so this review will be a lost opportunity to improve the governance of our communities for another six years. Thank you for the opportunity to make a submission on it's Initial Representation Proposal. I would like to be heard in support of my submission.

Under the Local Government Act 2002 (the LGA), the following statements are what the Council must adhere to in order to give effect to Māori:

In recognition of the above, I commend the Council for initating the opportunity to include Māori Wards in the 2022 local body elections and consider that this demonstrates a commitment from the Council to honouring it obligations to Māori by enabling a real voice in its decision making and gives effect to:

- Demonstrating good governance,
- Building relationships and partnerships,
- 3. Equity in bringing our communities together.

The key purpose of my submission serves to highlight the importance in ensuring that the Council's "good intent" to establish Māori Wards in the 2022 local body elections is reflected in its final representation arrangements. However, I express my disappointment in the Council with regards to the lack of respect it has shown to the Ruapehu District Māori Council, especially when there was an expectation from the Council for the Ruapehu District Māori Council to provide guidance in this space. In doing so, a recommendation was put forward to the Council and a resolution resulted. Following this, the Ruapehu District Māori Council held two pre-engagement hui at Marae in Raetihi and Taumarunui in August.

Feedback from this hui, strongly supported (3) Māori Ward councillors, however, it was then disappointing to see that these discussions were ignored by the Council in this 'initial representation proposal'. If the Council is to be authentic to enabling better decision making and developing better relationships with Māori as outlined in the LGA, then this is not what I consider to be the way of demonstrating that.

In recent consultation with the community, it was still being said, and expected from the Council that the Ruapehu District Māori Council would (be taking the lead to) discuss the next steps in terms of consultation with Māori to establish who may be suitable candidates for these seats. This is again disappointing to hear, especially when in reality the offer of representation in the first instance has only been to provide for a "token" voice, if this was not the case, then I would have expected to have seen support for (3) councillors, not (2).

I acknowledge the current general wards based system divided into (4) areas across the district highlights a number of complexites in terms of the Council's abiltiy to provide for fair and effective representation with the addition of Māori Wards. As a result, this supports some of the Council's 'initial representation proposal', but strongly opposes other parts.

The details of which, I have outlined as follows:

Although I support Council's desire to reduce the number of elected members for the purpose of being more efficient and effective, and to deliver better outcomes, reducing the current numbers should not be done in a manner that reduces the ability for Māori to have a lessor amount of ward representation i.e. as (2) instead of (3). Furthermore, reducing the number of Māori representatives, reduces the spirit of Council's obligations to Māori as outlined in the LGA. This is also an unjust means of providing "fair and effective" representation for Māori, especially when the current Māori population across the Ruapehu District allows for (3) Māori Ward representatives, so at the very least the Council should be supportive of this.

For this reason, I strongly oppose the Council's proposal to have (2) Māori Ward councillors and make recommendation that Council establish (3) councillors to be elected at large from one Māori Ward covering the entire district.

#### IN SUMMARY

I believe that Council's decision to establish Māori Wards across the Ruapehu District was made with "good intent" and to acknowledge its legalisative obligations to Māori and therefore, ask the Council to reflect upon this decision, and make the following recommendation:

That the number of Elected Members to Council be (10) consisting of:

- a) (1) Mayor (elected at large)
- b) (3) Māori Ward Councillors (elected at large)
- c) (6) General Ward Councillors (elected at large)

This is also an unjust means of providing "fair and effective" representation for Māori, especially when the current Māori population across the Ruapehu District allows for (3) Māori Ward representatives, so at the very least the Council should be supportive of this.


For this reason, I strongly oppose the Council's proposal to have (2) Māori Ward councillors and make recommendation that Council establish (3) councillors to be elected at large from one Māori Ward covering the entire district.




