



ePukaPuka - OverDrive

This is a growing collection of ebooks and audio books which we share as part of a consortium of other libraries in the lower North Island. Consequently, popular titles often need to be reserved. You can have up to 20 titles on hold and borrow 10 titles at a time for up to three weeks.

ePukaPuka has two apps you can download - Libby and Overdrive. Both can be found on the App Store or Google Play.

There is a help site in both apps on the menu icon.

The apps of both Wheelers and OverDrive offer many features, including highlighting sections of text, a dictionary and thesaurus. The reader is able to exercise full control over how the book is displayed – including background colour, font size and style.



Your eBooks are available even after you have disconnected from the internet and are on holiday without WiFi!

Have you run out of books to read but aren't able to get to the library?

Are you going on holiday but don't want your baggage weighed down with heavy books?

Do you struggle to return library books on time and are always paying overdue fines?

...then the library e-Book service may be the answer for you.

Electronic books (e-Books) are available through Council libraries. The service is very simple to use and allows access to the library e-Book catalogues 24/7 365 days a year. Items are automatically 'returned' on their due date without you having to visit the library – no more overdue fees!



To get started, you will need:

- A compatible digital device - iPads and other tablets, smartphones, notebooks and PCs, and most e-Book readers, with the exception of Kindle (although Kindle Fire may be used). They need to have a modern operating system or web browser.
- An internet or Wi-Fi connection.
- To visit or call a Council library to set up a personal password.
- A library card, you need the number (starting with RU) as a username to login.
