Freedom Camping in the Ruapehu District

Council welcomes responsible freedom campers to the Ruapehu District.

Council recognises that some restrictions are required to allow for safe and environmentally responsible freedom camping within the Ruapehu District.

Freedom Camping Policy

Council's Freedom Camping Policy is available on Council's website www.ruapehudc.govt.nz or from Council offices in Taumarunui, Ohakune and Raetihi.

The key principles of the policy are as follows:

- To allow for safe and environmentally friendly freedom camping.
- To reduce the damage to the environment by litter and spoiling.
- To improve transparency of Council's position on freedom camping with respect to the land it administers within the District boundaries.

Where can we Freedom Camp?

Freedom Camping is allowed on Council controlled public land, roads and reserves, except the domains, recreational, historic, scenic and amenity reserves listed in Schedule 1 of the Freedom Camping Policy.

Freedom Camping is allowed in:

- Ruatiti Domain, Raetihi
- Ohura: the area adjacent to Tui Street between the Memorial Hall and the Mangaroa Stream.

Freedom Camping Rules

In the interests of protecting campers and our environment, freedom campers in the Ruapehu District are asked to observe the following rules:

- Freedom Camping is permitted for certified mobile vehicles fitted with a minimum of three days capacity toilet and grey water storage facility. Freedom Camping in mobile vehicles not fitted with these facilities, in tents or sleeping outdoors, is **not permitted**.
- Freedom Camping in certified self-contained vehicles may occur in the locations as specified in the Freedom Camping Policy for a maximum of one night in any calendar month at any single location.
- Toilet and grey water must be disposed of at a Council approved dump station site.
- All refuse must be disposed of in an approved litter bin or a waste transfer station. Refer to Council's website for current Transfer Stations locations and opening hours.
- All sites used for freedom camping must be left in a clean and tidy state.
- Freedom campers must comply with any request to move on by any Authorised Officer.



Council Rubbish Bags

Council rubbish bags are available from any (local) supermarket or any Council office. Rubbish in an official pink bag can be dropped off for free at any Council landfill or transfer station in the Ruapehu District.

Council operates a District Landfill and recycling centre in Taumarunui along with Transfer Stations in National park, Ohura, Owhango, Ongarue and Ohakune (Waimarino). Details on locations for these can be found on Council website at www.ruapehudc.govt.nz.



Restrictions at Ruatiti Domain, Raetihi

Note that dogs are not permitted on the Ruatiti Domain from 1 December to the end of April each year and there is a liquor ban on the Domain from midnight on 30 December until midnight on 2 January each year.
