They are one of the most important groups of railway heritage structures in the country as they provided housing before the major railway settlements of the 1920s. Includes 16 original 'early type' Railway houses on the northern side of the road, they include: • 2 short verandah and gable type; • 7 full verandah type; and • 7 with simplified form with recessed entrance and no verandah. On the southern side of the road are 11 Railway houses in the later House Factory style of the 1920s, moved in from Taihape in the 1980s.

UM 3	4	Sunshine Settlement	Hikumutu Drive and Sunshine Road, Taumarunui	Various	No rules apply. For information only.	Built 1921 onwards. A group of 44 railway houses. In the main settlement there are 17 of the standard House Factory designs of the 1920s, 5 of the American design of the same period, 21 of the 1930s design, and 1 which may be a 1900 type house from opposite the Railway Station, that has been moved in.
